Student Implied Permission to Participate in Video Conferencing

By allowing my child to sign into video conferencing platforms, I grant permission for my child to participate in video conferencing (Google Hangout/Meets, Zoom, and Other Approved Video Conferencing Tools) during the time when remote learning is in place. By agreeing to allow my child to participate in video conferencing, I have discussed with my child the rules that govern appropriate video conferencing.

Rules:

- Remember you are on camera and live. The advantage of video conferencing is that you can take advantage of facial expressions and tone of voice. Remember to think before you respond to make your thoughts and ideas clear to the video conferencing participants.
- Adhere to the same standards of behavior during the video conferencing session that you would follow in “real” (face to face) life.
- Be mindful of your tone and expressions during the video conferencing session. This is not an anonymous session. Your voice, background/surroundings, and video are viewed by all who are participating in the session.
- Respect the context of the video conferencing session. Keep video conferencing sessions within the context of the conversation. If the session is recorded do not post isolated comments that may be taken out of context.

Video conferencing is a new communication platform. There are bound to be technical glitches. Please be patient with the participants during the session.

My child and I understand that the school code of conduct, which is posted on the district and school website applies to video conferencing.

By agreeing to allow my child to participate in video conferencing, I have discussed with my child the rules that govern appropriate video conferencing.

If I prefer that my child not engage in Video Conferencing, I understand that this means that my child may miss valuable information provided by the teacher.
